C.R.O.P. Hunger Walk/Rock

Youth to Participate in Heart of America C.R.O.P. Hunger Walk

2010 marks the 30th anniversary of the Heart of America C.R.O.P. Walk in Kansas City. The CROP Hunger Walk is **C**ommunities **R**esponding to **O**vercome **P**overty in an annual event that combines fun and fundraising to raise money for hungry people throughout the world. Walkers invite friends to sponsor them with a contribution of \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00 or more. Walkers come from the Greater Kansas City Metro religious community, schools, businesses and nonprofit agencies. Over 2,500 people walk in the Heart of America Hunger Walk each year. Hungry people in developing countries typically walk as much as 10 kilometers each day to get food, water, and fuel, and to take their goods to market. Crop Hunger Walk provides us an opportunity to WALK WITH THE WORLD. We walk to be in solidarity with their struggle for existence. We walk to make a difference.

CROP Hunger Walk is sponsored nationally by Church World Service (CWS), one of the most effective and efficient relief services in the world. Many of the items donated at Festival of Sharing also go to Church World Service. 75% of the money collected is distributed by CWS, which since 1946 has carried out global hunger education and provided money for refugees, disaster relief and self-help projects in more than 80 countries. 25% of the money stays in the Greater Metro Area and is distributed to local hunger-related agencies.

A recent email from Heartland Presbytery says, “Just this past week we learned that over 14% of those living in the United States are classified as living at or below the poverty level. These are hard times for many of our sisters and brothers. Now more than ever it is important for the people of God to witness to the teaching of Jesus ... ‘feed the hungry’ ... ‘as much as you do it unto the least of these, you do it unto me.’”

Youth from UCPC’s Safe Place Fridays and high school students will walk on October 10 at Jacob Loose Park beginning at 1:00 p.m. Please support them with donations and prayers. They will be in the Narthex on October 2 to tell you more about their mission project. You may also sign up to walk. Those who are not as steady on their feet may participate in the CROP Rock—that’s right rock in a rocking chair to show your perseverance and be an inspiration to all the walkers.

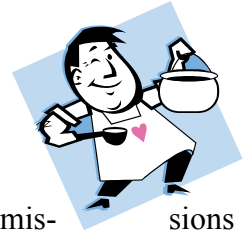
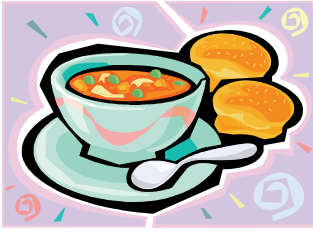

The United Christian Presbyterian Church has always held missions as a hallmark as the doors have been open for community agencies to hold meetings, youth and adult church groups to work, ecumenical table fellowship, and countless forms of giving through food, kind words, and deeds. For over 150 years this church has practiced Christian values beyond the walls of the building. Please continue this tradition by attending the UCP Annual Soup and Pie Cook-off, Silent Auction and Bake Sale Saturday, Oct. 9, 2010, from 5 to 7 pm in the fellowship hall. All proceeds from this annual fundraiser are returned to citizens in the Ray and Clay County areas and the state of Missouri. Tickets will be available at the door. Please invite neighbors as the dinner is open to all who wish to attend.

Church members are asked to volunteer their time, goods, and talents to create a successful evening. Please recall that each family is asked to donate a pie (dessert) to be served during the dinner and an item to be placed in the auction. Items should be newly purchased **not** garage sale items. In this time of economic stress people of all ages could auction a certificate of **service** like raking a yard, shoveling a driveway, cleaning a room, or creating a decorated birthday cake. Each of us have talents to be shared by others. Items can be homemade crafts or homemade baked goods like a lap quilt or baked dinner rolls. Homemade basket themes are fun to auction also: "Movie Night at Home" with popcorn, a DVD, and drinks; "Ice Cream Sundae Fixings"; "Italian Dinner"; "Barbecue Fixings"; and the list could go on! Please have your auction items to the church by Tuesday, Oct. 5th. Baked items, jellies, candy, or other homemade canned goods would be appropriate for delivery on Friday, Oct. 8th at 9 a.m. The Missions Committee needs the extra time to display donations and complete the forms as Saturday is very busy with last minute preparations.
